She is a Montessori certified teacher for ages 12-15 and has taught creative writing in public school through AmeriCorps, New York, grades 2-12; has experience teaching leadership workshops to teens through YMCA and experience teaching writing, current events, philosophy, and civics at Arthur Morgan School, North Carolina.
