Graham travels to schools around the country, performing World Music and retelling folklore for young people.

As a teaching artist he is active with the Wolftrap Institute for Early Learning, Memphis Center for Arts Education and Kentucky Center for the Arts, Birmingham International Arts Festival, The Tennessee Governor's School, and the Lincoln Center Institute for the Arts. Richards' educational music programs have recently been nationally profiled on NBC and CNN.
